But I found no trace of a family DE PAU in those places. If you think that the place of origin of your family is given as the west southern part of FRANCE, the three first names could be good and more precisely the n°2 and n°3. But "it"s a long way" from LISLE to MELBOURNE...

If you can send me more about Pierre DE PAU, I think that it is possible for me to write to the town-clerck of every town I found by "Minitel". But I need the date of the birthday of your parent for beginning my researches.

<u>Searched</u> General Index of Births for Scotland (1921-1920) for the birth of Matthew White. There were three entries for 1920. Noted the following:

On 29 August 1920, at 27 Dumbarton Road, Clydebank, Dist. Old Kilpatrick, Co. Dumbarton, MATTHEW WHITE was born. Son of John White, School Teacher and Isabella White m.s MacPherson. Parents married 1915, Mary 26th Glasgow.

<u>Searched</u> General Index of Marriages for Scotland (1942-1936) for the marriage of Matthew White. Noted the following:

On 12 November 1941, at Trinity Church, Dist. Ayr, Co. Ayr, after publication of Banns according to the Forms of the Church of Scotland,

MATTHEW WHITE aged 21 years. Bachelor. Flying Officer, Royal Air Force of Caerlon, Lenzie (now engaged in War Service). Son of John White, School Teacher and Isobel White m.s McPherson. (sic)

MARY VICTORIA DUNBAR aged 22 years. Spinster. Art Student of 37 Carrick Road, Ayr. Daughter of James Dunbar, Medical Practioner and Isabella Strachan Dunbar m.s Mellis (dec) Witnesses: James Dunbar, Knockronald, Carrick.

Ishbel White, Caerlon, Lenzie

Min: James R. Forgan, Trinity Church.

<u>Searched</u> General Index of Births for Scotland (1942) for the birth of a child to Matthew White and Mary Victoria Dunbar. I found no trace of this. The mother's maiden surname is given in the indexes after 1929 so it should be fairly easy to locate the births of children to a couple. They were only married for three months before he died - brings home the terrible sadness people must have suffered during wartime.

Searched General Index of Deaths for Scotland (1942) for the death of Matthew White. Noted:

MATTHEW WHITE F/Lt. 42928, 217 Sqn. Age 21 years. Country of Birth - Scotland. Died 21.2.42, Presumed. Lost at sea. Air Operations.

<u>Searched</u> Index to Confirmation and Inventories (1942) for a will left by Matthew White. There was not mention of this. I know that servicemen and women had to make wills during wartime but I am not sure where they were lodged at time of death. The Public Record Office at Richmond, Kew, should be able to help you with this query.
