Dear Sir,

You wrote to this Society on June 12th (Your Ref. EGD/CW) and I do regret that it has taken me until now to reply.

In answer to your questions, we have no record of Flt.Lt. White having escaped or evaded capture after being shot down on February 12, 1941. From the extract from the Public Records Office I rather fear that he and his crew were lost.

Regarding a photograph of a Beaufort I was on the point of writing to the RAF Museum at Hendon for one of the postcards which they supply of any type of wartime aircraft, but perhaps you could do this. Their address is: RAF Museum, Hendon, London NW9 5LL (Tel. (01) 205-2266).

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By coincidence a member of of the American Escape and Evasion Society, the Reverend James E. Armstrong, has been in touch with us to say that he crossed from Douarneznez to Falmouth in the fishing vessel BREZEZIEL arriving on January 25, 1944. He is curious to know whether the BREZEZIEL returned safely to France and whose boat it was. With him on the trip were three RAF men, viz. : Sgt. Nick Matthews, Leslie Woollard and Flt.Sgt. Max Fiedler. Of these three Leslie Woollard was a member of the RAF Escaping Society until his death in 1985. He was hidden in Douarnenez by a Madame D. KERVAREC who lived then at 16, rue Jean Bart. Monsieur Michel MAZEAS might care to contact our member Gordon CARTER who lives at Hiboud an Dour, Ar Gouez, 22620 PLOUBAZLANEC (Tel. 96-55.86.04) and who has extensive knowledge of wartime events in the region.

We are looking for a lot of historical details about history of our town, DOUARNENEZ, a fishing harbour, in the western part of BRITTANY.

We are trying to write a book about all the events we are able to know, from to day to the prehistorie days.

I am in charge of the story of all the airmen who lived in DOUAR-NENEZ, or all the airmen who participated in an event in relation with the story of our town.

About one of those events, I cannot find all the details I need. I hope that you can find it for me!

It is about the bombing of TREBOUL, a village near DOUARNE-NEZ, on November the 28th, 1941.

I believe it was an action of the "COASTAL COMMAND", which probably started from SAINT . EWAL, or ROBOROUGH (CORNWALL). But, I am not quite sure.

The target was an Hôtel ("Hôtel de la Baie"), in front of the beach, where a lot of Kriegsmarine's officers, used to meet, in a quiet spot, near an interesting fishing harbour.

The date of one of those meetings was sent by radio from a "Réseau" of French Résistance to their "correspondants" in England. If it is possible, can you send me the official note about this event, and if it is not possible, just only the type of the aircraft (was it a "BRISTOL BEAUFORT" ?), the name of the pilot and his "curiculum vitae", and what it resulted about the action.

Unhappily MATT WHITE was shot down on 12 February 1942 during a sipping-strike, on the day of "Channel Dash". He is buried at the General Cemetery, Hook of Holland.

Basil HAMMERSLEY and Leslie P.D. FORDHAM also died, and their bodies were not recovered.

But one of the members of the crew who bombed TREBOUL is still alive and well. I did receive a letter from him last week.

You are right, Eric, When you wrote me about this involves time!

I know very well Gordon CARTER. He is one of my friends.

About the escape of James E. ARMSTRONG, on 1943, he is a friend too! He came back to Douarnenez on 1981 for a short visit, 37 years after his escape.

The world is a small bowl ! Best wishes to all our friends in Falmouth (I met, on 14 july, Philip FOX and the crew of "Quaker Girl". We spent a good moment at TREBOUL and at home !). Yours sincerly. Michel

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
